Recently, Eilis and Heather were discussing how to explain to those who ask what exactly it is that we write. What do we write that they would like? The comparison "If you like horror, you won't like us!" came up, but we nixed it because it just sounded too negative (and Eilis doesn't watch or read horror, so she wouldn't know how to make that comparison).

With Eilis's *Introducing Sonika*, it's not that hard to find a comparison. It's a romance about a superheroine, so if you read comic books (and wished there had been a real romance somewhere in there), you'd like *Sonika*. Also if you like urban fantasy and paranormal, something like *Buffy the Vampire Slayer*, you'd like *Sonika*. Or if you like to read about a skittish cat who decides she'll get along with a patient hero, for that matter (my salute to my late cat Rover).

If you like high fantasy or stories by Robin D. Owens in her fantasy series from Luna Books, stories in which everyday people leave their comfortable world they know and step into an unfamiliar place, or stories about dying

people doing one last good thing, you'll like *The Sleeper Awakes*. Or if you like telepathic horses, for that matter.

If you like movies or stories like *Flower Drum Song* or *Sayonara* or even *Snow Falling on Cedars*, multicultural romance with Asian or Asian-American characters and folklore and contemporary romance, you'll like *Festival of Stars*. Or stories that take place in Seattle, for that matter. Stories using the raven folklore in a way you may not be familiar with? That's right here.

And what about Heather's work and Anh's work? Those are interesting challenges too, because those works span such a wide range.

Heather's work spans romantic comedy, romantic suspense, and contemporary romance. Her *Cards Never Lie*, a romantic comedy, would be enjoyed by those who liked the earlier works of Jayne Ann Krentz (from the 1990s), fellow Cerridwen author Ashlyn Chase, or upcoming author Gina Robinson, whose first book, *Spy Candy*, will be coming out in November (for those who are wondering why we're mentioning a book that's not even out yet, Gina and Heather critique together).

Heather's King County Confidential series, *One Juror Down* and *Two on Hunt*, would be appreciated by legal thriller or romantic suspense lovers, those who like Lisa Gardner, for instance. Or if you happen to be a category romance fan and you love books in the Harlequin Intrigue line but you would like to read a slightly more complex story, you might want to give those two a try.

Gunshot Grange has some similarities to Nora Roberts' new novel *Tribute*, though of course they are entirely different. Then there's *In Flight*, Heather's latest novel, which might be right up the alley of those who are fans of Julie Cohen's and Jenna Bayley-Burke's writing.

Then there's *Looking Forward*, *Looking Back And Other Stories*, Heather's anthology of futuristic romance. If you're a fan of light sci-fi or coming of age stories, you'll like these.

And then there's Anh's work, which is erotic romance. If you love short erotic romance writers like Brynn Paulin or stories about werewolves in general, give "Lucky Number Seven" a try (also if you like Rebecca York's work). If you like a little bondage in your stories after trying Joey Hill, give "Bijou's Bonds" a read.

Do you like sexy historical romance? Heather's "Aphrodite's Necklace" might be right up the alley for those
